

This week our focus topic has been 'Easter'. We have read books such as, Hot cross bunny, five little chicks and Spots first Easter.



Activities this week at pre-school:

- Easter paintings! The children painted an egg using pastel Easter colours. They painted using pom poms dipped in paint to make spots.
- Natural Easter egg hunt! The children went on a hunt around the school for different flowers and leaves to decorate an Easter egg. They put them on a sticky shaped Easter egg.
- Baking Easter nests using melted chocolate and shredded wheat. The children then had them for snack later in the day.
- Tasting Hot cross buns! The children tried hot cross buns for their morning snack. They tried to butter their own hot cross bun.
- Easter shop! The children played in an Easter themed role play area. They
 had Easter bunny ears, egg boxes, toy chicks, toy bunnies, Easter eggs
 etc.
- The children played with mini chicks. They had to find and pick them out of the pretend grass.
- The children decorated lots of Easter eggs using different craft materials.

Dear Parents/Carers,

On Tuesday 26th March we are planning to take the children in Taw and Codden class on a trip to The Quince Honey Farm. During the visit the children will learn about bees, observe honey being harvested, make a candle, explore the gardens and have a play in the Hive Play Area. The PTFA have kindly offered to subsidise the cost of the trip, so the cost per child will be £10.50, which includes coach travel and entrance to the Honey Farm. Please pay via Eduspot/SchoolMoney.

If your child does not usually attend Pre-School on this day they are welcome to join us but in order to cover staff/child ratios your child must be accompanied with a paying adult. Unfortunately, we do not have capacity on the coach to take additional children/parents so we would ask that you make your own way to The Honey Farm and meet us there. The entrance cost would be £9.50 per child Payable via Eduspot/SchoolMoney. Please speak to a member of EYFS staff if you have any questions regarding this.

We will be departing and returning within usual school hours. Reception children must wear their school T-shirt and jumper, everyone needs to wear warm trousers, footwear that may get muddy (we recommend wellies!), a waterproof coat. We will be eating lunch at The Honey Farm, if you require a school packed lunch there is an option of cheese or ham roll which you are able to book on Eduspot/SchoolMoney, otherwise children may bring their own packed lunch. We request that there are no nuts, sweets or fizzy drinks. All children will need to bring a drink in a refillable drinks bottle. School will provide a snack. If you are meeting us there, please could you bring your child a packed lunch, we ask that you do not book your child a school packed lunch via Eduspot if your child is not attending school that day. If your child wears nappies or is toilet training please ensure that you provide enough nappies/changes of clothes, wipes for the day. Please could your child bring a small named backpack in which to carry their lunch, drink, nappies etc.

To summarise: Your child will need...

- Waterproof coat
- Warm clothes (Reception children school jumper, own bottoms)
- Shoes that can get muddy (wellies)
- Packed lunch Either from home or a school lunch booked via Eduspot
- Refillable water bottle
- Nappies, wipes/changes of clothes if required In order for the trip to take place we would be very grateful of parent helpers.
