Thank you to those of you who did the home learning finding objects made of different materials in your home. This week we were very excited to carry out our investigation to find the most comfortable and protective material for Humpty Dumpty. All the eggs cracked except the one wrapped in cardboard. We wrote a letter to Humpty Dumpty reporting our findings.

In maths, we have been subtracting 1-digit and 2-digit numbers from a 2-digit number, we have used base 10, ten frames, number lines and partitioning to reach the previous 10 to support our learning.

In English, we have practised writing sentences using verbs in the present tense and noun phrases and we have planned our class story, 'The Adventures of Traction Man in School'.

This week in History we have explored the main events of the 1960's and discussed how these events influenced the toys of that time. We have found that many toys we have now were invented in the 1960's, we listened to some music by the Beatles and drew, labelled and wrote information about our favourite toy.

We had a visit from a member of staff from the Dog's Trust this week. The children enjoyed learning about how to be safe around dogs, give them space and stroke/snuggle them when appropriate.
