



## Home Learning - Week 10

This week we have...

- Learn to retell the story of the Owl Babies by acting it out using our story telling spoons.
- Learnt the sounds j v w x and have written and read CVC words using these sounds. We learnt some more 'tricky words' (words we can't sound out) go and no.
- Explored light, dark and shadows using torches in our dark den.
- Explored mark making using feathers and paint.
- Use junk modelling and collage materials to create owl puppets to retell the story.
- In Maths we have been learning to double and halve numbers.
