This week we have...

- Drawn a picture and written a simple sentence about what we did at half term.
- Recapped all of the sounds that we learnt before half term, practised reading and spelling words using them.
- Created firework pictures by printing and mark making using pastels.
- Enjoyed creating firework dancing using ribbons and streamers.
- Thought carefully about how to keep safe on Bonfire Night.
- Use junk modelling and collage materials to create our own fireworks and rockets. We thought carefully about different ways of attaching the materials so bits don't fall off!
- Learnt to read, write, recognise, count and partition numbers 7 and 8.
