This week in English, we have identified what makes good speech in a story. We have used a picture from the book and practised verbally what Grendel and Mum might be saying. We have practised adding speech marks and a reporting clause to some speech from the story.

In Maths, we have been using base ten to partition two and three-digit numbers into how many hundreds, tens and ones make the whole number.

This week in Art, we re-capped primary and secondary colours then we explored how to make tertiary colours. From our school grounds we noticed the main colours of our landscape is green, we collected items from the field and mixed colours to match.

In Science, we have been recapping the five animal groups and classifying them according to the food they eat.
